**Date(s):** *October 7, 8 & 9, 2011*

**Time:** *9 am to 5 pm on Oct. 7 & 8*  
*9 am to 4 pm on Oct. 9*

**Place:** *Amy B.H. Greenwell Ethnobotanical Gardens*

**Cost:**

The fee for each class is \$225.00 (for all 3 days). There will be no refunds, except for good cause, should you need to cancel or are unable to commit to all 3 days. Any refunds will be assessed a \$25.00 administrative fee from any funds tendered and the balance shall be returned to you via U.S. Mail to the address provided in this application.

**Class Description:**

***Beginners:*** *Students in this class will learn to de-bark, strip the wauke and receive instructions on preparation of wauke and beat a 1 ft. square piece of wauke into a finished product.*

***Intermediate:*** *Students in this class will receive instructions and beat a 1'x2' piece of wauke into a finished product.*

***Advance:*** *Students in this class will receive instructions and beat a 2'x3' piece of wauke.*

In addition, all classes will also receive "How to" instructions on dyes, 'ohe kapala, kapa implements, cultivation and care of wauke.

All classes require a commitment of 3 full days of instructions. ***There will be Kapa Masters and highly knowledgeable individuals on hand to answer questions and offer advice.***

**Equipment:**

All participants must have their own implements (i.e. kua pohaku, kua kuku, hohoa, 'i'e kuku and niho 'oki). Implements may be purchased before hand with the exception of the kua pohaku (stone anvil). You will also need a fine mist spray bottle, pocket knife or a potter's loop.

If you would like to purchase the required and/or individual implements, as mentioned above, you may log on to [www.kauluhawaii.com](http://www.kauluhawaii.com) and place your order. Purchases can be mailed or picked up at the Ka Ulu Hawai'i booth on the day of the festival. The kapa set does not include the kua pohaku. Cost of each set is \$250.00 (festival price only). Orders must be placed by **SEPTEMBER 01, 2011** as it will take a minimum of 2 weeks to complete individual orders.

As another alternative, you may sign up for the **JUNE 18, 2011 Kapa Pa'ahana Workshop** and make your own implements just in time for the festival. Click on the link on the main page to find out more information, cost and registration with the Volcanoes National Park Service 'Ike Hana No'eau Program.

Participants who do not have any implements and do not wish to purchase any, may rent the required equipment @ \$25.00 per day (x 3 = \$75.00) and must be paid at the time of registration.

\*\*\* ***Workshop Participants Only:*** Participants are welcome to set up camp on the grounds of the garden for the duration of the festival only. Set up may occur only on the day before on 10/06/11. If for some reason you need to set up earlier, please contact us and we will try to accommodate you.
